SUBJECT: Home and Community Based Services

POLICY

The policy of the Department of Human Services is to provide a broad range of non-Medicaid-funded, community-based services that support and assist older individuals, persons with disabilities, and their caregivers who may not require intensive medical services to continue living in their homes and communities. These social and health-related services promote health, self-sufficiency and independence.

E. Definitions

Older individuals are persons in the age group 60 and over.

Community Based Services include supportive services such as: Home Delivered Meals, Senior Center Meals and Programs, Adult Day and Adult Day Health, Homemaker Services, Case Management, Health Promotion, Medications Management, Respite Care, Information and Assistance, Employment, Caregiver Support Services and Evidence-Based Health and Wellness programs.

F. Responsibilities

The program administrator of the Livable Communities Section of the Division of Aging Services is responsible for oversight of the development and updating of requirements in the Home and Community Based Services Manual.
