**SUBJECT: Provision of Temporary Cash Assistance to Needy Families**

**Policy:**

The policy of the Department of Human Services is to provide temporary assistance to needy families to ensure that children may be cared for in their own homes, to assist needy parents to end their dependence on government benefits, to prevent and reduce the incidence of out of wedlock pregnancies, and to encourage the formation and maintenance of two-parent families.

**C. Applicability**

All county Division of Family and Children Services offices in Georgia are subject to the authority and references specified above.

**D. Definitions**

A needy family is a family whose income and resources fall within standards established by the state. Temporary assistance refers to the time-limited nature of cash benefits.

**E. Responsibilities**

1. The Director of the Division of Family and Children Services is responsible for developing, issuing and updating the Economic Support Services Program Manual. The Program Manual is indexed as [MAN3390](#).
2. The Director of the Division of Family and Children Services is responsible for ensuring that the Georgia Gateway computer system is a federally certified statewide system that supports and maintains the economic support function.

The outcome of this directive is evaluated by the Evaluation and Reporting Section of the Division of Family and Children Services. The Evaluation and Reporting Section's Economic Support unit conducts planned, intensive, annual reviews of County offices to determine if they are in compliance with federally-mandated standards for accuracy and timeliness. Failure to meet the standards may result in loss of federal funding.
